PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT

Fiscal year 2023 (1 April 2022 – 31 March 2023) included nine months of the NSL's 40th anniversary. Since its incorporation in June of 1982, the organization has sought to support the U.S. Submarine Force wherever possible.

Early days saw the creation of a quarterly journal and the inception of a classified technology symposium, in addition to an annual meeting of members. Our goal was to promote awareness, by all elements of American society, of the need for a strong undersea arm of the United States Navy.

Today, we provide highly anticipated conferences, both classified and unclassified, so that industry, academia, and government can come together to identify, study, and develop potential solutions to undersea warfare challenges. Our submarine force speakers are known for staying throughout the conference to engage in informal discussion during breaks. Our support is valued by the Navy as evidenced when leadership asks us to organize specialty seminars. We are proud to present awards at our Annual Symposium to active duty and acquisition professionals in recognition of excellence at our Annual Symposium.

We began with four chapters (Groton, Hampton Roads, San Diego, and Bremerton) and now there are ten, with several inquiries about additional ones. Many of our members participatae in chapter activities, but are also able to participate in the submarine community even if they don't live near a chapter. In recent years, outreach programs such as the speakers bureau, the mentor program, and industry briefs have developed more opportunities. Headquarters staff help members participate in commissioning committees and "sub clubs."

Many non-profit organizations are losing members and support, but the NSL is maintaining steady growth in membership and financial support. The capital campaign is well on the way to paying off the \$1.1M mortgage on the national headquarters building. Some key figures for FY23 are listed below.

OUTREACH PROGRAMS

SPEAKERS BUREAU

Members of the NSL across the U.S. are available to speak to local civic groups, schools, and businesses. NSL presentations educate the public about the importance of submarines to the national defense. NSL video with slides and talking points are provided electronically and often the speaker is a retired submariner and can include stories and anecdotes from personal experiences. The NSL membership is proud to have 130 members participating in the Speakers Bureau program

SUB CLUBS

The NSL offers support and ideas to interested parties in forming organizations dedicated to supporting crews and their families. This Fiscal Year (FY) the NSL completed the Sub Club Guide and made it available to members. The guide has information and templates about how to join or start a Sub Club. Sub Club zoom meetings were well attended with many ideas shared and questions answered. Some examples of activities that Sub Clubs participate in include care packages for the crew, holiday cards and ornaments, and arranging namesake visits.

MENTORSHIP

During the past fiscal year 71 NSL members were registered in the NSL mentorship program. Mentors and mentees have one-on-one support and make connections with members of the submarine force or industry. Participants fill out a questionnaire on a web-based platform that uses an algorithm to set-up potential matches for the mentor/mentee relationship. Individuals then can choose from the suggested matches and are connected via email correspondence.

NROTC

The NSL presents an Outstanding Achievement Award to a graduating NROTC student approved for entry into the Navy's nuclear propulsion program as a submarine officer. This past fiscal year, over 40 students received the award. NSL members eagerly volunteer to represent the NSL during the NROTC Unit's award ceremony.

FISCAL YEAR 2023 FINANCIAL REPORT

The following table shows the League finished the fiscal year in sound financial condition. The League finished the fiscal year "in the black" with revenue exceeding expenses on both a cash and accrual basis.


Accrual based revenue is significantly higher than actual cash flow because it includes donations (Reserve and Capital Campaign). On a cash flow basis, 90% of expenses went to program services; 10% went to general management and fundraising activities. (Fundraising expenses were less than 1%.)



The League's investment portfolio, our Reserve Fund, totaled \$2,237,663 at the end of FY2023 (March 31, 2023). With an operating budget approaching \$2 million, our goal is to build the Reserve Fund to a level 2 to 3 times the operating budget. To support this objective, all unrestricted donations since April 2017 have been deposited in the Reserve Fund and not used for monthly operating expenses. In FY2023, unrestricted donations totaled \$91,399.

By the end of FY23, the Capital Campaign had pledges of \$1,112,832 and had received \$1,078,078 (restricted donations) toward our goal of \$1.5 million. These funds are used to retire the mortgage on our new office at an accelerated rate and to recover refurbishment expenses. The League is grateful to all corporate and individual donors who support this effort.
